Explanation of significant increases in the budget (explanation required if Proposed Percentage Change is greater than 2%).

The increase in General Services is to maintain the General Basic maximum levy rate of \$3.50 per \$1,000 of taxable valuation, to fund the restoration and remodel of Marshall County buildings following the 7/19/2018 tornado without plans for long-term financing, and to raise the additional \$422,646 requested by the Communications Commission while maintaining current services. The increase in Rural Basic tax dollars funds the maximum transfer to the Secondary Roads Department and maintains a portion of the Sheriff's Office services, along with the services of the Zoning, Sanitation and Weed Eradication departments and a one-time increase to the Central Iowa Fairgrounds. The overall urban and rural tax rates are unchanged from FY2019/2020.

The above tax rates do not include county voted levies, mental health and disabilities services levy, debt service levy and the rates of other local jurisdictions.

Regarding proposed maximum dollars, the Board of Supervisors cannot adopt a higher tax asking for these levies

following the public hearing.
